The most recent example is an exhibition (on view through August 2013) at President Lincoln's Cottage, called "Can You Walk Away?" in commemoration of the 150th anniversary of the Emancipation Proclamation. Lincoln's Cottage teamed up with Polaris Project, a 10-yr old non-profit organization, whose mission is to "combat human trafficking and modern-day slavery, and to strengthen the anti-trafficking movement through a comprehensive approach."



The Florida Modern-Day Slavery Museum is a cargo truck that serves as a replica of trucks that were involved in recent agriculture slavery operations. It toured the state of Florida in preparation for the Farmworker Freedom March on April 16-18th, 2010. It partnered with The Coalition of Immokalee Workers (CIW) who is at the forefront of modern-day agriculture slavery.



On October 9, 2010, the first-ever permanent exhibition on modern slavery opened in Cincinnati, OH at the National Underground Railroad Freedom Center. The museum partnered with several non-profit organizations, including Goodweave, Free the Slaves, International Justice Mission, and Polaris Project. The exhibition, titled "Invisible: Slavery Today", highlights the causes and impact of modern-day slavery but also the anti-slavery movements that are in effect.
